STATE LEAGUE COMPETITION RULES

- These regulations are made by Baseball WA Limited (Baseball WA) pursuant to the Baseball WA
 Constitution.
- 2. All clubs that are admitted to the WA State Baseball League (SBL) State League Competition are bound by the Baseball WA State League Compliance Regulations.

MANDATORY TEAMS & JUNIOR METRIC

- 1. Each club is required to field each of the following teams in every competition season:
 - a. State League
 - b. State League Reserves
- 2. Each club is required to meet the minimum 0.20% Metric based on the Baseball WA School Zone population.
- 3. Each club is required to meet the 75% retention Metric based on the Baseball WA School Zone population.
- 4. A club may meet its Junior Metric (Points 2. and 3.) via agreement with another club/s within its School Zone population.
- 5. Any agreement with another club/s must be approved by Baseball WA's Competitions Department.
- 6. If any agreement is made with a club/s outside of the Baseball WA School Zone population, the zones will be combined, and the Metric must be met based on the new population.
- 7. A breach in any one Competition Season is classified as a Category 1 breach. A second breach is classed as a Category 2 breach. A third or subsequent breach is classed as a Category 3 breach. Refer to Baseball WA State League Compliance Regulations for more information.

FORMAT

- 1. Clubs will be ranked based on WINNING PERCENTAGE = ((WINS + .5 TIES) / TOTAL GAMES)
- 2. If teams are tied:
 - a. The team having the best win/loss record in games contested between the two teams will be ranked higher.
 - b. If teams are still tied in the standings, the team having the best runs against per defensive innings (RUNS AGAINST / DEFENSIVE INNINGS) in the games contested between the tied teams will be ranked higher.
 - c. If still tied, teams will play a 1 game tie breaker to determine the higher ranked team.
- 3. The Club whose A Grade Team finishes in first place at the end of the season will be eligible to 'Play-off' for a place in the State League Competition, if:
 - a. They do not currently have a State League Team in the competition.
 - b. The club must meet all Mandatory Teams & Junior Metric.
 - c. A club may chose to not exercise its right for promotion if it so wishes.

- 4. The Club whose State League Team finishes in last place at the end of the season will be eligible for relegation to A Grade.
- 5. Should a vacancy be created within State League, by a club exercising its right to nominate in a lower division, Baseball WA reserves the right not to fill that vacancy.
- 6. If a State League Club is removed from the State League Competition for failure to meet its compliance obligations, Baseball WA reserves the right to not fill that vacancy.

PROMOTION & RELEGATION PLAY-OFF

- 1. A three (3) game series will be played to determine if a team or club is promoted or relegated.
- 2. The Club that wins the play-off will earn the right to compete in the State League Competition in the next season and the Club that loses the play-off will compete in A Grade.
- 3. The play-off games will be played under the following conditions:
 - a. 9 Innings
 - b. State League Club Home Team
 - c. A Grade Club Away Team
 - d. No import players allowed
 - e. If no result at the conclusion of 9 Innings, International Tie-breaker Rules will apply until a result is determined.
 - f. The game will be hosted at Baseball Park
 - g. Games will be scheduled Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday during the WA SBL State League Grand Final Series.

PROMOTION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- 1. Clubs must supply Baseball WA with its Club Constitution, AGM Minutes & Financial Reports.
- 2. The club must provide to Baseball WA a document that outlines its Organisational Structure, showing all Executive Positions and the names of individuals appointed to each role.
- 3. The club must appoint two (2) Coaches to the accreditation program.
- 4. The club must appoint two (2) Scorers to the WA Baseball Scorers Association.
- 5. The club must accredit two (2) Umpires the WA Baseball Umpires Association.
- 6. The club must appoint a person for the treatment of players to the minimum qualifications as outline in the State League Compliance Regulations.
- 7. Baseball WA may, in its absolute discretion, allow an exemption to compliance with any of the State League Compliance Regulations or the dates for which criteria must be satisfied.
